# PREVENTION & HARM REDUCTION

A Comprehensive Harm Reduction program is now open at the Peninsula Health District in Newport News! Open on Mondays & Thursdays from 9a-3p. The program offers compassionate, no-judgment support for people navigating substance use. On site, they provide syringe exchange services, harm reduction kits (with hygiene and wound care supplies), and harm reduction counseling and assessment. A plan to expand the program at the Hampton Health District this year is also in the works.

# POLICY & LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY

An initial Health and Human Services budget shows that the department plans to cut funds for naloxone initiatives in an effort to cut spending. The \$56 million First Responders-Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act (FRCARA) has put naloxone in the hands of police, firefighters, and EMTs. This grant is funded through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, or SAMHSA. Federal funding plays a crucial role because naloxone is easily accessed in some parts of the country, but difficult to get in others.

#### TRAUMA & RESILIENCY
